Commission 4 Space Operation and Utilization

Minutes of Meeting

Saturday 19 October 2019 - 13h00-16h00 Washington DC, USA

1. Welcome Commission Chair

Chair of Commission 4 R. Laufer opened the commission 4 meeting, welcomed all commission 4 members, ex-officio members and interested participants and friends of commission 4 (see list of participants in the addendum of this document).

The chair welcomes the members of the commission leadership for the 2019-2021 period: he congratulates P. Gasbarri for being appointed as new vice chair now and he welcomes R. Mugellesi-Dow as the new secretary of commission 4 - he also congratulates R. Mugellesi-Dow for just being elected full member of the academy. The chair thanks M. Ovchinnikov to agree to a second term as past chair due to former chair A. Tsuchida's resignation.

The chair provided a brief report of the restricted commission plenary meeting (just preceding the commission 4 meeting) lead by secretary general J.-M. Contant:

- IAA leadership is pleased with the number of cosmic studies remaining at around 40 studies at any time over the past five years - commission 4 ranging at six studies or more (placing second behind commission 3).
- IAA leadership proposes more dialogue between commissions especially at the time of review of studies and publications.
- IAA leadership reminds in the technical reports from chairs and rapporteurs of conferences and symposia to be compiled by the office for publication - availability shall be via the IAA website.

2. Adoption of the Agenda

Commission Chair

3. Adoption of the Minutes of Commission 4, Paris, March 2019 meeting

The chair expresses his apology that the minutes of the March 2019 commission 4 meeting in Paris are not available yet via the IAA website - adoption of the minutes will be requested at a later date.

4.1 Current Studies

Study Group 4.17 Chair or representative: Cappelletti/Graziani

Space Systems for Biomedical Research

More participants have expressed interest in the study group; the draft report for review will be presented during the Spring Meetings in March 2020.

Study Group 4.19 Chair or representative: Holm/Horikawa/Coradini Promoting Global Space Knowledge & Expertise in Developing Countries

A survey has been finalized and more universities have been involved; the survey addressed three types of audience: retirees, people that need to use data or create apps, and startups/SMEs. It has been proposed to held a 90 min workshop to suggest best practices. The survey should be early complete January 2020 and IAA could promote it. Different topics have been discussed with representatives from African regions and from African Union. In March 2020, the results of the survey will be incorporated in the web site, the database and a list of experts; at IAC2020 a draft report of the study should be ready.

The proposal was made to continue the study in the form of permanent committee to have a formal presence in IAA. This will provide permanent continuation of the study. This approach is encouraged by commission 4 and its members.

Study Group 4.20 Chair or representative: Bao Weimin/Contant Space Information Application in Earthquake Emergency Response

No response was received so far. The chairs need to be contacted to check the status of the activity which maybe will be closed.

Study Group 4.22 Chair or representative: Teofilatto/Filatyev Through Optimization of Aerospace Trajectories

The report has been delayed in the planning, therefore, it will be sent in the next days. P. Gasbarri has joined the group, as well as I. Mazzini from Thales Alenia; the draft report will ready for the Spring Meetings in March 2020.

Study Group 4.24 Chair or representative: Mugellesi-Dow Knowledge Management for Space Applications

The project with the Mexican Space Agency has been described in handout delivered to the Commission 4. The results of the project will be presented during the Spring Meetings in March 2020.

Research on Space Information Sharing Technology with Satellite Integrated Network

The proposal was already reviewed and requests for changes were made concerning a more international membership. The focus of the study has been reviewed and now it is centered on the Global Satellite Data Sharing mechanisms. The proposal has been sent with the updated form and second chair to commission 4 for review and was accepted and approved by commission 4.

Cubesat Interface

The proposal concerns of the standardization of the cubesat interfaces, in particular the electrical and mechanical ones. The study group has a well organized management and should promote international collaboration for cubesat. Study should be completed in 3 years, input to ISO draft is foreseen in 2021.
