## a. 'Academy Day' vs 'Academy Weekend'

Academy Day activities recently have been changed to be scheduled over two days: the Saturday and Sunday before the start of a Congress. At present the activities referred to as 'Academy Day' do not include the Commission meetings or the SAC meeting, key activities in the life of the Academy.

Commission VI members feel that the term 'Academy Day' as used by the IAA should include the meetings of the Commissions and the SAC meeting. It is thus recommended that the term routinely used by the Academy to refer to these activities be 'Academy Weekend', in place of the present 'Academy Day' that does not embrace them.

## b. Board of Trustees review process

The Academy is requested to ensure that the final draft of a report that has been the subject of material changes be sent to the author(s)/contributor(s) for a final OK prior to release.

## 6. Any other business
