#### ANNEX V

#### Other activities

In 1998 a special visit of Woomera was organised.

In 1999 a special dinner with the participants to the first IAF congress in 1950 was organised.

In 2001 <u>visits</u> of the Congreve sites and Latécoère plant were organised in Toulouse. A teleconference was held with <u>Arthur Clarke</u>. Proposals for opening by Patrouille de France, a diaporama on French space history, and special inaugural historical pyrotechnics with Ruggieri/Lacroix were rejected.

In 2003, the History Committee organized the venue of <u>Boris Chertok</u>, including its participation in an special international press conference about German engineers who went abroad after WW II. A <u>visit</u> of Peenemünde also was organised.

A planned joint <u>Current Event</u> in 2004 with the Space Transportation Symposium on Canadian engineers who left the cancelled Arrow program for the Gemini program, eventually was held as an invited paper during the latter's symposium.

A planned Current Event on Sputnik in 2007 eventually was taken over by others.

A plan to establish a web site came to nothing.
